SUBJECT: 2017-18 Child Care and Child and Family Program Service Agreement Package

We are pleased to provide you with your 2017-18 child care and child and family program service agreement package. This package includes:

- 2017-18 service agreement
- Updated 2017-18 Ontario Child Care Business Practice, Service and Funding Guideline ("guideline")
- Wage enhancement and home child care enhancement application form
- Other relevant supporting documents (where applicable), including:
 - Statement of Attestation and Conformity Ministry of Education 2017-18 Health & Safety Funding
 - Child and Family Program Serious Occurrence Form
 - Ontario Works Overview Document

Please refer to the applicable sections of the guideline for details on each of your specific funding lines noted in the budget schedule of your 2017-18 service agreement.

Ministry Updates

A. Child and Family Programs

The Ministry is currently working on several key priorities to support child care and early years programs including the provincial plan for moving forward with the integration and transformation of child and family programs to establish Ontario Early Years Child and Family Centres (child and family centres) by 2018. This plan will result in Ministry-funded child and family programs (Ontario Early Years Centres, Parenting and Family Literacy Centres, Better Beginning, Better Futures, and Child Care Resource Centres) becoming part of a cohesive system of services and supports guided by a provincial framework, a common identity and a new funding approach. This transformation will help us achieve our shared goal of establishing increasingly integrated early years programs and services in Ontario.

First Nations who currently receive Child and Family Program funding will continue to receive this funding (previously referred to as Family Support Programs funding).

B. Wage Enhancement and Home Child Care Enhancement Grant (HCCEG)

The Ministry has made an ongoing commitment to support a wage increase for child care professionals employed in the licensed child care sector through the wage enhancement and Home Child Care Enhancement Grant. In 2017, the wage cap has increased by approximately 1.5% to \$26.68/hour for wage enhancement and \$266.80 per day for full HCCEG (\$160.08 for partial HCCEG). The 2017-18 guidelines have been updated to reflect that same and included in this package you will find a 2017-18 wage enhancement and HCCEG application form to be submitted to the ministry by June 30, 2017.

C. Full Day Kindergarten (FDK) Transition Funding

FDK Transition funding was established in 2012-13 to help child care centres on-reserve transition during FDK implementation. As full-day kindergarten is fully implemented, 2017-18 will be the final year for FDK Transition allocation. This funding will be provided to First Nations communities for child care in 2017-18; however it will be allocated on a different basis after 2017-18. More information will be shared over the upcoming year.

D. 2017-18 Reporting

Beginning in 2017-18, First Nations who receive over \$350,000 will no longer have to submit interim reports. This change is intended to reduce the administrative burden on the First Nations that have to submit this report and to allow First Nations to focus their financial reporting efforts on the year-end Financial Statements submission.

2017-18 Health and Safety Funding

In the EYCC1 Memo: 2017-18 Child Care Health and Safety Funding, the ministry invited First Nations to apply for 2017-18 Health and Safety funding. Applications will continue to be accepted throughout the fiscal year. First Nations are encouraged to submit their applications for Health and Safety funding to the ministry as soon as possible to allow for projects to proceed in the warmer months.

2017-18 Cash Flow

Monthly cash flow in 2017-18 will initially be based on the most recent 2016-17 entitlement.

Once the 2017-18 signed service agreement is received by the ministry, monthly cash flow will be updated to reflect your 2017-18 allocation.

Pending receipt of the signed child care service agreement by June 30, 2017, child care cash flow for 2017-18 allocation will be updated in August 2017. The August payment will include a lump sum payment so that cash flow is reflective of your 2017-18 allocation.

Cash flow for wage enhancement/HCCEG also requires completed wage enhancement and HCCEG application forms. The ministry will continue to flow based on 2016-17 entitlement until 2017-18 wage enhancement applications have been approved. Please note that the signed service agreement must also be returned to the ministry before the 2017-18 wage enhancement cash flow is updated.

2017-18 Key Dates

The signed 2017-18 service agreement must be submitted to the ministry by **June 30, 2017**. For your convenience, First Nations have the choice of submitting their signed service agreement by **email** to: <u>tpa.edu.earlylearning@ontario.ca</u>, or alternatively by regular mail.
