SUBJECT: Student Transportation – Contracting Practices

I am writing to provide you with additional information about student transportation and the contracting practices pilot projects.

Over the last year, the Ministry has engaged the sector through various initiatives and discussions to provide appropriate support in adopting best practices in contracting transportation services. Based on the draft resource package developed by the Contracting Practices Advisory Committee, the Ministry initiated pilots in three consortia sites using these tools and competitive procurement. The pilots are intended to leverage lessons learned so that the draft tools and the procurement processes can be reviewed and refined. The experience gained will also support the development of a suitable transition strategy for the sector in moving towards the public sector procurement standards.

With the completion of these pilot RFPs, the Ministry is currently analyzing and evaluating the results of the pilots. Based on this analysis, refinements to tools and processes will be made. Furthermore, to ensure a comprehensive understanding of the results, the Minister intends to consult with sector stakeholders before determining our next steps. Communications will be issued in early fall to provide clarity on the procurement direction for the sector for the 2010-11 school year. In the meantime, we would ask consortia management to focus on ensuring appropriate contracts are developed to reflect the fuel escalator/de-escalator and performance management clauses, and that all contracts be signed before the start of the new school year. For school board and consortia staff that were unable to attend Ministry workshops on the fuel escalator/de-escalator, please visit our transportation website for the posted presentation slide decks and sandbox tool as they may assist in the development of fuel clauses in contracts.
